

Virginia Wins the Parish Award Fourteenth Straight Year

For Virginia, a major highlight of the 2022 General Court, which ran from June 23 to 26 in Boston, was the award ceremony where Virginia received the Parish Award. The Award is given annually to the state Society demonstrating the best overall performance in accomplishing the objectives of the Order, as reflected in the Societies Annual Reports for the previous calendar year. The Virginia Annual Report for 2021 documented all of our Society activities, from attendance, including OFPA greetings, at numerous lineage society events, presentations to ROTC and JROTC cadets, to Midshipmen at the Naval Academy, and to National Guard Units. Donations to the John Quincy Adams Foundation to further their programs of support for historical and educational projects around the country also are counted, as are our efforts to extend public awareness of the OFPA through our newsletters and coverage of our activities in the news media.

Congratulations to all in Virginia who worked to earn this award again this year.





Governor's Report on the 126th General Court

The 126th General Court gave the OFPA an opportunity to visit a number of the historically significant sites in Massachusetts. The meeting, hosted by the Massachusetts Society, was held in the historic Omni Parker House Hotel, located in the center of Boston on what is designated as the Freedom Trail, a 2.5-mile-long path through Boston that passes by 16 locations significant to the history of the United States. Marked largely with brick, the Freedom Trail winds from Boston Common in downtown Boston through the North End to the Bunker Hill Monument in Charlestown. A few of the more widely known places along the Trail are the site of the Boston Massacre, Paul Revere's home, the Old North Church from which the lanterns were hung to speed Paul Revere and William Dawes on their way, and the USS Constitution, Old Ironsides.

Tours outside Boston included visits and wreath laying in Lexington and Concord, plus a wreath laying at Dorchester Heights. Another tour went to Plymouth and Plymouth Rock for a VIP Tour of the Plimoth Patuxet Museum.

A special evening outing was dinner and a guest speaker at Faneuil Hall, the top floor of which is the headquarters, armory and museum of the Ancient and Honorable Artillery Company of Massachusetts, the oldest chartered military organization in the western hemisphere, chartered in 1638 by the Great and General Court of Massachusetts as a volunteer militia company.

At the conclusion of the General Court, our new Governor General, Ed Horton, swore in the OFPA General Officers for 2022 to 2024. Three from Virginia were sworn in; Shane Newcombe as Treasurer General, second from left, Mike Weyler as Historian General, fourth from left, and Walt Sheffield as Attorney General, fifth from the left.







Governor's Report on the 126th General Court

While most of my report seems to be about having a good time, we did conduct the business of the Order. In a new initiative, Past Governor General Wright is working to establish a U.S. Coast Guard Academy Award similar in nature to the current awards at the Military Academy, the Naval Academy and the Air Force Academy. Details to be worked out.

As to other business, the General Court approved its next annual budget, approved an OFPA document retention policy, and approved the Distinguished Service Award for Medal of Honor Winner Herschel Woodrow "Woody" Williams (recently deceased).

On the negative side, but by mutual agreement, the OFPA retired the South Carolina Society chapter because of apparent lack of interest within the South Carolina Society.

Patriot John Holker's Grave is Marked by the SAR in Clarke County



On April 2, 2022, in the town of Millwood, Clarke County, Virginia, the Colonel James Wood II Chapter of the Virginia Sons of the American Revolution conducted a grave marking ceremony for John Holker, a Patriot of the American Revolution. Since John Holker was an immigrant from France who worked closely with the French to ensure victory in the war, the event was also attended by members of the French military delegation stationed with NATO in Norfolk.

The OFPA was represented by our Registrar and Historian, Rich Rattan (photo at the left), who gave greetings and presented out Society wreath. Other VA OFPA members in attendance were Governor Michael E. Weyler and Associates Jeff Thomas and Doug Hall. Rich Rattan's greetings, which included both English and French, were as follows:

Good afternoon, and greetings from the Virginia Society of the Order of the Founders and Patriots of America as we celebrate the marking of the grave of John Holker, an English industrialist, diplomat, and true Patriot for the American Revolution. While he is celebrated for his industrial espionage, he was also instrumental in influencing the French to support the American Revolution, and to believe that the fledgling Continental Army had a chance of defeating the

English. While he may not have fired a musket on a battlefield, his skill as a diplomat was superb. He is a Patriot in every sense of the word and deserves our respect for his duty to America and ability to bring an essential ally into the fight. The VA OFPA is proud to pay homage today to John Holker.







Five Grave Markings in Lovettsville, Virginia



On April 10, 2022, at the New Jerusalem Lutheran Cemetery in the town of Lovettsville, Virginia, three SAR chapters, Fairfax Resolves Chapter and Sergeant Major John Champe chapter from the Virginia SAR and Sergeant Lawrence Everhart Chapter from the Maryland SAR (photo below), held a grave marking for five Revolutionary War Patriots. The five Patriots whose graves were marked were; Frederic Belse, Michael Boger, John Compher, Michael Cooper, Sr., and John Fawley.

The presidents of both Virginia and Maryland SAR's spoke at what has now become a regular bistate event. Each year five patriot graves are marked in this cemetery with many more Patriot graves yet to be marked.

Virginia OFPA Governor Michael E. Weyler brought greetings from our Society, presented our VA OFPA wreath, and participated in the Color Guard. Also present as Drummer in the Color Guard was Associate Doug Hall.

The ceremony ended with a 3 volley musket salute from a firelock squad of 12 men.



President James Monroe's Birthday Ceremony at his Tomb



On April 28, 2022, at Hollywood Cemetery in Richmond, Virginia, the James Monroe Memorial Foundation celebrated President Monroe's 264th birthday at his tomb located in the Presidents Circle of Hollywood Cemetery. On April 23, five days earlier, they had conducted a ceremony at his birthplace in Westmoreland County, that earlier celebration being detailed above.

Prior to the Memorial Foundation's program, Major General Mark Simerly, the U.S. Army's Chief of Ordnance and Commanding General of Fort Lee, led a Presidential Wreath Laying Ceremony. By law, a nearby senior military officer is tasked to present the President's wreath at the tomb of each past U.S. President on their respective birthdays.

Virginia OFPA Governor Michael Weyler brought greetings and presented the VA OFPA wreath, which was one of 63 wreaths presented by local, state and national lineage and historical society members in attendance. Other VA OFPA associates in attendance were Past Governor Mike Lyman and Associates Doug Hall and Josh Wilberger.



While we celebrate James Monroe as our fifth president, he was also the last president who saw active service in the American Revolution. He eventually became governor of Virginia and a Senator from Virginia. In the War of 1812 he served simultaneously as both Secretary of State and Secretary of War under James Madison, whom he then succeeded in the presidency.

During his greeting, Governor Weyler reminded the listeners that the the story of any Patriot usually also involves the story of a Founder;

Today we also honor a young, 22 year old Scott, Andrew Monroe, one whom we would call a Founder, who came to Virginia in 1641 when it was mostly wilderness, seeking liberty and a chance to raise a family and build a legacy of freedom in the new world.

He raised a family and successfully passed on that spirit of liberty to his descendants, such that a century and a half later, his great-great grandson was elected as the fifth president of the United States of America. This was James Monroe's legacy of liberty, and it is also our legacy as Americans, a legacy built over the last 400 years. God bless the United States of America.

Grave Marking of Patriot John Ford

John Ford was a soldier who saw significant action during the war. He raised a family that spread through out the country, a number still living in the area. Several direct descendants attended the ceremony, including Brooks Lyles, Deputy Commander of the SAR National Color Guard, who came up from South Carolina. Brooks was the guest speaker, who spoke not only of the individual units in which John Ford saw service, but also of John's father and his contributions,

Governor Weyler's greetings included the following:

Today we also seek to remember John Ford's family roots. The Ford family, like so many others who, in the English Civil War, supported the Royalist's cause against Parliament and Cromwell, were in danger in England, so many came to America to distance themselves from those perils.

One of those, a youth, later referred to as John Ford the Immigrant, arrived in Virginia as an indentured servant, and soon became a valued member of the community.

He raised a family and created a legacy of liberty for those generations that followed, a legacy that included resistance to an overreaching Parliament, which would lead to his great grandson, John Ford the Patriot, taking up arms against an overreaching Parliament, again, and fighting for an independent nation.

Raid at Martin's Station, General Martin and Martinsville



On May 14, 2022, in Martinsville, Virginia, the Martin's Station Chapter and George Waller Chapter of the Virginia Sons of the American Revolution held a ceremony at the Old Henry County Courthouse commemorating General Joseph Martin and The Raid at Martin's Station.

Virginia OFPA members present were Governor Michael E. Weyler and Associate Jeff Thomas. Governor Weyler brought greetings and presented the OFPA wreath. Both Weyler and Thomas participated in the Color Guard.

Founding Father, explorer, diplomat, military leader and statesman, at both the end of the colonial period and the American Revolution, Joseph Martin opened the West to settlement. Later his courage and diplomacy cleared the way for America's decisive victory at Yorktown, so much so that President Theodore Roosevelt once said, "If not for Joseph Martin—we may have lost the Revolution."

As a diplomat for the states of Virginia, North Carolina and Georgia, Martin persuaded the tribes south of the Ohio river, those same tribes he had fought during the French and Indian War, to remain neutral during our fight for independence, which allowed those militia on the frontier to join the fight in Virginia and the Carolinas, which eventually led to Yorktown.

Governor Weyler's greetings included the following remarks:

Neither Joseph Martin's story, nor the story of America, began with the Revolution. It began more than a century and a half before the Revolution.

Joseph Martin's story began in Jamestown where, in 1608, Thomas Graves, an original investor in the Virginia Company, arrived to begin a new life. He was a settler, a soldier and one of the founding members of the first freely elected parliament in the new world, the Virginia House of Burgesses. His spirit of service to Virginia was clearly passed on to his fourth great grandson, Joseph Martin.

Today we honor both the Founder and the Patriot.







Joint Virginia SAR & Virginia 1812 Plaque Dedication in Norfolk



On May 21, 2022, at the historic Cedar Grove Cemetery in Norfolk, Virginia, a Plaque honoring six Revolutionary War Patriots and twenty War of 1812 Veterans, placed at the entrance to the cemetery was dedicated in a joint ceremony sponsored by the Virginia Sons of the American Revolution and the Society of the War of 1812 in Virginia.

Our Virginia OFPA Deputy Governor Dr. Kenneth L. Hawkins, in his capacity as an SAR Chairman and War of 1812 Second VP, served as the master of ceremonies. He also presented our VA OFPA wreath, one of the fifteen presented. Past Governor Mike Lyman carried the Flag of the Order in the Color Guard. A third member of VA OFPA who participated in the ceremony was Associate Timothy Ahlgrim.

On May 24, 2022, at the United States Naval Academy in Annapolis, Maryland, a Marine Corps Awards Ceremony was held for the eleven best of the class of 2022 among the 275 Midshipman who have selected to enter the Marine Corps.

The Lt.Gen. Herman Nickerson Award is a Marine Officer Sword given in memory of General Nickerson, past Governor General of our Order and recipient of the Army Distinguished Service Cross, the second-highest military award our nation can give, for his extraordinary heroism in Korea

The sword is given to the graduating Midshipman Marine Selectee who had demonstrated superior leadership, integrity and potential as a future Marine Corps officer.

This year's award, based on a selection by the Academy faculty, was presented to Midshipmen First Class Lauren Anderson by Captain Michael E. Weyler, CEC, USN (Ret), Governor of the VA OFPA and Deputy Registrar General of the OFPA,.

The Admiral Dewey Award at the U.S. Naval Academy in Annapolis



On May 26, 2022, at the United States Naval Academy in Annapolis, Maryland, the Class of 2022 Prizes and Awards Ceremony was held in Alumni Hall. Over 100 prizes and awards were given to the Midshipmen in three categories: Leadership and Professional Awards, Academic Awards, and Individual Athletic Awards. The OFPA Admiral Dewey Award is a Naval Officer Sword given to the midshipman of the graduating class who stands highest in the professional courses in naval weaponry and who excels in the weapons phase of professional training through demonstrated mastery, possesses a genuine interest of the subject matter, and displays excellent potential for success.

In presenting this award, the Order of the Founders and Patriots of America seeks to honor and keep alive the memory of Admiral of the Navy George Dewey, the Victor at the Battle of Manila Bay in the Spanish American War in 1898.

This year's award, based on a selection by the Academy faculty, was presented to Midshipmen First Class Lucy Ackerman by Captain Michael E. Weyler, CEC, USN (Ret), Governor of the VA OFPA, Deputy Registrar General of the OFPA, and a member of the Naval Academy's Mechanical Engineering Faculty from 1982-1984.

In keeping with our VA OFPA focus of showing the connections through history between Founder and Patriot, a highlight of the presentation was showing our June 2021 grave marking ceremony for John Lewis, a Founder who left a significant legacy of liberty. John Lewis was the ancestor of their own chapter's namesake, Colonel Fielding Lewis, a Revolutionary War leader and brother-in-law to George Washington. Another of John Lewis' descendants was Meriwether Lewis, leader of the Lewis and Clark expedition. Focusing on such connections as these shows the legacy of liberty left by America's Founders.

Dedication of Colonel William Preston Memorial in Botetourt County, VA

On Saturday, June 11, 2022, in Daleville, Virginia, a Memorial Dedication ceremony co-sponsored by Botetourt County and the Fincastle Resolutions Chapter, Virginia SAR was held to honor the Patriot Colonel William Preston. William Preston served in the Virginia House of Burgesses and was a colonel in the militia during the American Revolutionary War. He was also one of fifteen that signed the Fincastle Resolutions. A licensed surveyor, he with his wife Susanna, established a farm at Greenfield in 1762. William Preston held every major office in Botetourt County, which was created in 1770.

Since William Preston is well known to many across southwest Virginia, in the area where he once lived, around 100 people came out for the dedication of his memorial. In addition to state and local SAR officers, also present were members of the DAR, County officials and a guest speaker, Dr. Daniel Thorp from Virginia Tech, who addressed William Preston's history.

Virginia OFPA Governor Michael E. Weyler presented the OPFA wreath and carried the National Colors in the VASSAR Color Guard.







246th Anniversary of the Virginia Declaration of Rights

On Saturday, June 11, 2022, at Gunston Hall, George Mason's home in Fairfax County, Virginia, the George Mason Chapter, Virginia Sons of the American Revolution celebrated the 246th anniversary of the Virginia Declaration of Rights, a document for which George Mason was the primary author.

The Virginia Order of the Founders and Patriots of America was represented by our Registrar/Genealogist Rich Rattan and Associate Jeff Thomas. Rich Rattan brought greetings and presented our OFPA wreath. His remarks included the following:

Today, we celebrate the adoption of the Virginia Declaration of Rights by the Virginia Constitutional Convention on 12 June 1776, its subsequent use by Thomas Jefferson in crafting the opening for the Declaration of Independence, and its basis for the Bill of Rights and the first 10 amendments to the Constitution. At the same time, the OFPA also celebrates and honors the great grandfather of George Mason IV, who was George Mason the first, a Founder of our country. He was born in Pershore, Worcestershire, England in 1629 and immigrated to the colony of Virginia in 1652, arriving on the ship Assurance in Norfolk, Virginia. George Mason I was a Cavalier, obliged to leave England after the defeat of Cavalier forces by Oliver Cromwell in 1651. Settling in Stafford County, he served as sheriff in Stafford County, was a member of the Virginia General Assembly, and the House of Burgesses. George Mason I began a legacy of liberty and public service to Virginia and the United States which was passed down to his children, grandchildren, and eventually to his great grandson, George Mason IV, the author of Virginia's Declaration of Rights.

Today, the OFPA honors both the Founder and the Patriot for their contributions to the establishment and growth of America. It is good to remember the roots upon which our country is built.







Virginia OFPA Celebrates Flag Day 2022



On Saturday, June 14, 2022, the Virginia Society of the Order of Founders and Patriots of America was represented at the Flag Day Ceremony held at the MacArthur Memorial in Norfolk, Virginia, and hosted by the Great Bridge chapter of Daughters of of the American Revolution. Presenting the wreath was Deputy Governor Dr. Kenneth Hawkins. Also in attendance was Tim Ahlgrim, a recently inducted society member.

Excerpts from an article by Chris Foran in the Milwaukee Journal Sentinel dated June 10, 2022, read as follows:

"On June 14, 1885, Bernard Cigrand, a teacher in Waubeka (an unincorporated part of Fredonia in Ozau-kee County), put an American flag on his desk at Stony Hill School and asked his students to write an essay about the flag's importance."

"Other communities around the country followed suit, but it wasn't particularly organized. In 1916, President Woodrow Wilson issued a proclamation calling for a nationwide observance of June 14 as Flag Day."

In his proclamation, Wilson said: "It has therefore seemed to me fitting that I should call your attention to the approach of the anniversary of the day upon which the flag of the United States was adopted by the Congress as the emblem of the Union, and to suggest to you that it should this year and in the years to come be given special significance as a day of renewal and reminder, a day upon which we should direct our minds with a special desire of renewal to thoughts of the ideals and principles of which we have sought to make our great Government the embodiment,"

In spite of Wilson's proclamation, it was still an on-again, off-again thing. That changed in 1949, when Congress formally designated June 14 as Flag Day across the country. The first federally sanctioned Flag Day was June 14, 1950.

This is how the OFPA Handbook describes the OFPA flag.

"SECTION 3. COLORS. The colors of the Order shall consist of the National Colors or Flag as prescribed by an Act of Congress, and the colors of the flag of the Order. The latter shall be cross, Gules, on a field, Argent, with canton, Azure, a constellation of thirteen stars, Argent."
