

# **Society Events**

#### **Battle of Green Spring**



The Battle of Green Spring (aka Battle of Jamestown) on July 6, 1781 is a little known footnote in the history of the Revolutionary War but was the largest battle in Virginia before the Siege of Yorktown, The battle was fierce and bloody, and part of a chain of events that ultimately resulted in the George Washington's victory at Yorktown. Dr. Kenneth Hawkins, Governor of the Virginia Society of the Order of Founders and Patriots of America presented the Society's wreath.

#### **Battle of Cricket Hill**

July 8th was a typical July day in Southeastern Virginia. The Commemoration of the Battle of Gwynn's Island (aka Battle of Cricket Hill) was hosted by the Richard Henry Lee Chapter of the Virginia Society, Sons of the American Revolution. The battle took place when Patriot forces bombarded the British

ships at anchor on Gwynn's Island where John Murray, the Earl of Dunmore, the last Royal Governor of Virginia had landed and set up camp after being deposed in Norfolk. This was a signal victory for the Patriots just days after the Second Continental Congress adopted the Declaration of Independence. The guest speaker was Jeff Thomas. He recounted the lead up to the battle after the British loss at Great Bridge. His presentation was most interesting as it included comments from his ancestor, David Baker who served as a Corporal in the 3rd Virginia Regiment who wrote, "The first service that I saw was the cannonading at Gwynn's Island against Governor Dunmore." Dr. Kenneth Hawkins, Governor of the Virginia Society of the Order of Founders and Patriots of America brought greetings from the Society. Other Society members present included Past Governor Myron Lyman, Secretary James Russell, and Associate Jeff Thomas.



## **Society Events**



**Battle of the Capes** 

Saturday, September 3, 2022 was a beautiful end-of-summer day in Southeastern Virginia where over 190 people gathered at the bronze statue of French Admiral de Grasse to commemorate the 242nd Anniversary of the Battle of the Virginia Capes. The statue was a gift from France and recognizes the Admiral's singular naval victory over the British Royal Navy. Making it especially eventful was the international patriotism displayed as the majority of attendees at this Norfolk Chapter SAR event were French military personnel and their families.

The Battle of the Capes was a crucial battle in the Revolutionary War. Rear Adm Sir Thomas Graves led a British fleet of 19 ships of the line against a French fleet of 24 ships of the line led by Vice Adm Francois Joseph Paul, Comte Grasse. The Continental Navy did not participate. The outcome of the battle was strategically decisive as it prevented the British from reinforcing or evacuating Lord Cornwallis' forc-

es at Yorktown. The French then, were able to gain control of the entrance to the Virginia Capes and led to the British surrender at Yorktown just a month later. Christopher Melhuish, in a Virginian-Pilot article, stated, "Decisive local superiority at sea assured by de Grasse's ships sealed the fate of the British Army at Yorktown. British strategy had assumed the Royal Navy would maintain continuity of naval superiority in North America. When the Royal Navy lost that, Britain lost America."

The event was attended by 40 organizations. Robert Bruce, Chapter President of the Norfolk Chapter SAR was the Master of Ceremonies. Representing the Virginia Society OFPA, Governor Dr. Kenneth Hawkins presented a wreath. Other Society members in attendance were Associates Tim Ahlgrim, Jeff Thomas and Phil Barnard. Thirty nine other organization also presented wreaths.
