I am looking forward to seeing you there.

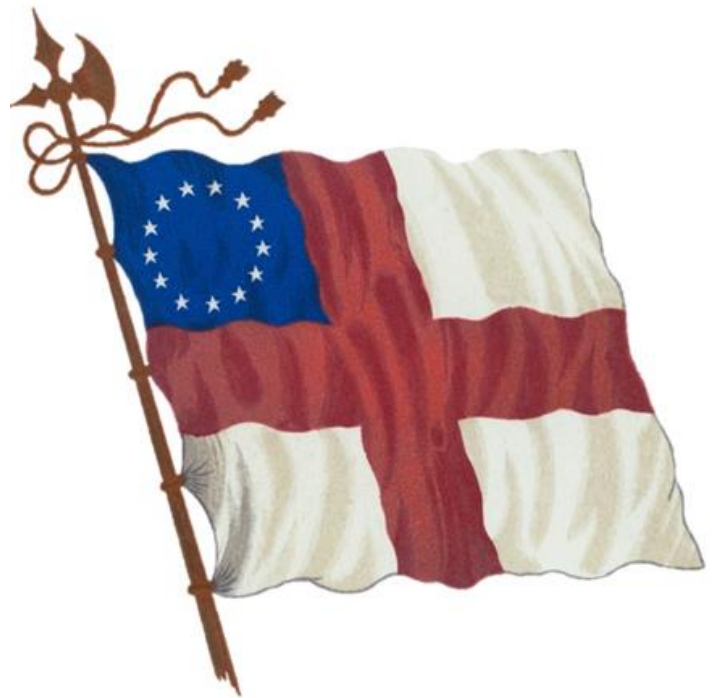

## Battle of Green Spring



The Battle of Green Spring (aka Battle of Jamestown) on July 6, 1781, is a little-known footnote in the history of the Revolutionary War but was the largest battle in Virginia before the Siege of Yorktown,

The British had 8000 soldiers and the Patriots had only 900. The battle was fierce and bloody, and part of a chain of events that ultimately resulted in George Washington's victory at Yorktown. The Williamsburg Chapter of SAR hosted the 243rd Commemoration of its anniversary. Dr. Kenneth Hawkins, Governor of the Virginia Society of the Order of Founders and Patriots of America presented the Society's wreath.

recounted the lead up to the battle after the British loss at Great Bridge. His presentation was most interesting as it included the reading of diary entries from Patriots that participated in this battle.

## Battle of Gwynn's Island (aka Battle of Cricket Hill)

July 9<sup>th</sup> was a typical July day in Southeastern Virginia. The Commemoration of the 248<sup>th</sup> Anniversary of the Battle of Gwynn's Island (aka Battle of Cricket Hill) was hosted by the Richard Henry Lee Chapter of the Virginia Society, Sons of the American Revolution.

The battle took place when Patriot forces bombarded the British ships at anchor on Gwynn's Island where John Murray, the Earl of Dunmore, the last Royal Governor of Virginia had landed and set up camp after being deposed in Norfolk. This was a signal victory for the Patriots just days after the Second Continental Congress adopted the Declaration of Independence.

## Battle of the Virginia Capes

The Battle of the Virginia Capes was a crucial battle in the Revolutionary War. Rear Adm Sir Thomas Graves led a British fleet of 19 ships of the line against a French fleet of 24 ships of the line led by Vice Adm Francois Joseph Paul, Comte Grasse. The Continental Navy did not participate.

The outcome of the battle was strategically decisive as it prevented the British from reinforcing or evacuating Lord Cornwallis' forces at Yorktown. The French then, were able to gain control of the entrance to the Virginia Capes and led to the British surrender at Yorktown just a month later.

Christopher Melhuish, in a Virginian-Pilot article, stated, "Decisive local superiority at sea assured by de Grasse's ships sealed the fate of the British Army at Yorktown. British strategy had assumed the Royal Navy would maintain continuity of naval superiority in North America. When the Royal Navy lost that, Britain lost America."



The event was attended by 40 organizations. Robert Bruce, Former Chapter President of the Norfolk Chapter SAR was the Master of Ceremonies. Representing the Virginia Society OFPA, Governor Dr. Kenneth Hawkins presented a wreath. Other Society members in attendance were Associates Tim Ahlgrim, Jeff Thomas and Phil Barnard. Thirty nine other organization also presented wreaths.

## 250th Fairfax Resolves



Fairfax Resolves and George Washington chapters of the Virginia SAR hosted the celebration in honor of the 250th Anniversary of the Fairfax Resolves in historic Old Town Alexandria, Virginia.

The Fairfax Resolves were written by George Mason and adopted by a Fairfax County committee chaired by George Washington on July 18th, 1774. The Resolves came in response to the Intolerable Acts (also known as the Coercive Acts), passed by the British Parliament in March 1774 to punish the colonies after the Boston Tea Party. Twenty-five patriots signed the Fairfax Resolves, which have been called "one of the most important documents in American history" and "the best single document for understanding the constitutional and legal issues between the colonies and England."

The celebration culminated with the dedication of a plaque at George Washington's Townhouse, just two blocks from where the Resolutions were signed. In attendance was Deputy Governor Philip Barnard and Associate Jeff Thomas.

# In Memoriam



With great sadness, the Virginia Society reports the passing of our fellow Virginia OFPA Associate and good friend, Donnel Jerome "Jerry" Hubbard. Jerry passed away on July 13, 2024.

Jerry was born on January 12, 1945, in Sacramento, California, to Donald Philip and Lucy Lillian Campbell Hubbard. After graduating from Sandy Union High School in Sandy, Oregon, in 1962, Jerry proudly served his country by joining the United States Army. He served in the Army Security Agency and was stationed in Okinawa.

Following his successful military service, Jerry retired from the Federal Government after 29 years of dedicated service. In addition to his federal career, Jerry had a strong desire to serve his local community. He worked for the Culpeper Farmers' Cooperative, catering to local farmers, ranchers, 4-H Clubs, horse enthusiasts, and other community members. Jerry also volunteered at the Culpeper, Virginia Police Department, where he performed various administrative duties and enjoyed participating as an active role player in the regional training academy which served other law enforcement agencies as well.

In 1967 Jerry married the love of his life, Shirley Elaine Irvin, with whom they shared 56½ years of marriage. Together, they raised their daughter, Dr. Carmen D. Booker of Laurel,

Maryland, and their son, Christopher Lee Hubbard of Brisbane, Australia. Jerry is survived by his wife Shirley, his children, son-in-law James Lloyd Booker Jr., and five grandchildren: Jasmine, Leah, and Kaia Booker, along with Liam and Ainsley Hubbard. He is also survived by six sisters: Luree, Celie, Jane, Rose, Debra, and Heather, along with many other loving family members.

Jerry had a passion for genealogy and was a member of several hereditary organizations that promote patriotism and maintain historical records for future generations. His memberships included the Order of the First Families of Connecticut, the Culpeper Minute Men Chapter of the Virginia Society –Sons of the American Revolution, the Society of Colonial Wars, the Hereditary Society Daughters of the Founding Fathers of America (as an *Honorary* Member), and The Order of the Founders and Patriots of America-Virginia Society.

Jerry's heart was with the Virginia Society of The Order of the Founders and Patriots of America, which he joined on August 21, 1989. He served the organization with distinction and honor, volunteering for various leadership positions, including Governor of the Virginia Society, National Registrar General, editor of the Virginia Society newsletter—*The Virginia Cavalier*, and as the Virginia Society Historian. He promoted and presented certificates for the highly successful programs namely the JROTC and the ROTC. Additionally, he served as an advisory Councillor to the Virginia Society. Jerry valued representing the Virginia Society OFPA at grave marking ceremonies, where he offered greetings and honorably presented the society wreath and/or colors, thus honoring those brave Founders and Patriots before us. He also proudly participated in parades, assisting with the display of the Virginia Society OFPA banner along the parade route. Jerry used every conceivable means to promote the Virginia Society of The Order of the Founders and Patriots of America!

In his early years of membership with the OFPA, Jerry was instrumental in the successful navigation of the Virginia Society as their Governor during the late 1990s. His leadership skills and depth of knowledge were respected by other societies as well, who often sought his opinions and guidance. When Jerry became a Society Councillor, he drew upon his extensive knowledge and vast experience in the operations of the Virginia Society to formulate his responses, thus benefiting the organization. Because of his steadfast commitment and unwavering service to the Virginia Society of The Order of the Founders and Patriots of America, Jerry was presented the highly prestigious societal award namely--the Virginia Cavalier Award.

Jerry was a man whose passion for heritage and unwavering dedication left an indelible mark on this organization. He loved his family, God, and his country! He distinguished himself in many ways, personifying the Order's motto: "***Steadfast for God and Country.***"

A Celebration of Life was held in Jerry's honor on August 6, 2024, followed by an inurnment at Culpeper National Cemetery in Culpeper, Virginia, with full military honors.
