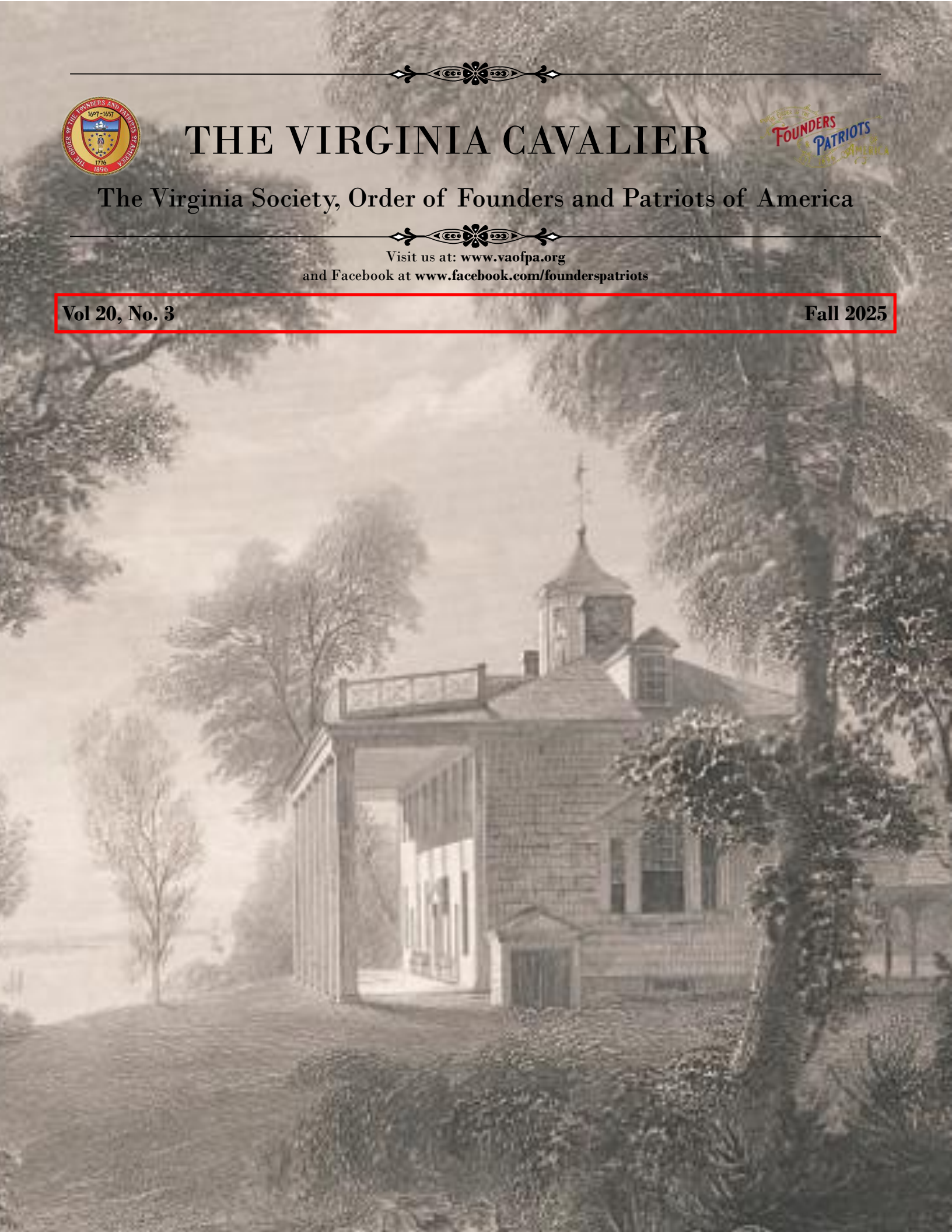

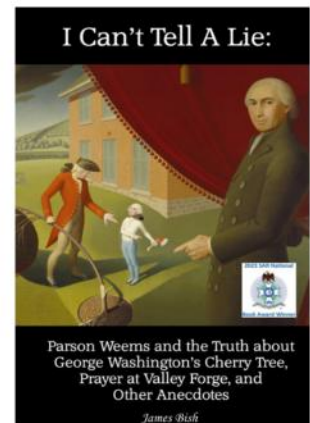

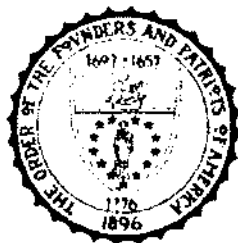
Mr. James “Jim” Bish will be our guest speaker. Jim grew up on a cattle and horse ranch in Nebraska and from an early age was fascinated with stories from his grandmother about their ancestors who homesteaded the area in the 1870s. This love of history and genealogy led Jim to discover that his founding ancestors lived in nine of the original thirteen colonies, with fifteen serving in the Revolutionary War. That passion grew into Jim earning his graduate degree in history and education. He then moved to Virginia where he spent nearly 40 years researching and teaching local, regional, and Virginia state history. Currently, Jim operates “History Happened Here” Tours and volunteers with the National Museum of Americans in Wartime Experiences Voices of Freedom Project and the Museum of Culpepper County. In 2023, he authored “I Can’t Tell a Lie: Parson Weems & the Truth about George Washington’s Cherry Tree, Prayer at Valley Forge, and Other Anecdotes.” He will speak to us about this recent publication.

249th Anniversary of the Virginia Declaration of Rights at Gunston Hall



On August 2nd, Governor Barnard gave greetings on behalf of the Virginia OFPA at the gravesite of George Mason IV in honor of the 249th Commemoration of the Virginia Declaration of Rights, for which Mason was the primary author.

The event, which was very well attended, was hosted by the George Mason Chapter of the Virginia Society of the Sons of the American Revolution. Attending with him was former Governor and current VASSAR President Mike Weyler.

From his own research, Governor Barnard provided the crowd with a rare insight into the workings of the Grand Committee which was formed by the Fifth Virginia Convention in 1776 and charged with drafting this Declaration of Rights and our Virginia Constitution.

A detailed history of George Mason's family lineage was given which allowed Governor Barnard to conclude his remarks by paying respect to George Mason IV as a Virginia Founding Father who, like the members of our Order, was a descendant of a distinguished line of Founders and Patriots.

244th Anniversary of the Battle of the Virginia Capes

The Norfolk Chapter VASSAR hosted a group of 350 French and Americans at Expeditionary Base

Fort Story in Virginia Beach, VA, for the 244th Anniversary of the Battle of the Capes on September 6, 2025.

The commemoration took place at the Admiral de Grass Memorial statue, a gift from France to the United States in 1976. The statue is in a small park and shares the same location as the Cape Henry Cross marking the location where the Jamestown Settlers first landed in 1607.

Over forty patriotic organizations from Virginia and North Carolina attended the event and offered wreaths. Special guests included the NSSAR President General, Michael Elston; Admiral Pierre Vandier, French Navy, who served as guest speaker; Vice Admiral Doug Perry, U.S. Navy; Vice Admiral Simon Asquith, British Royal Navy; Rear Adm. Frédéric de Rupilly, French Navy; Col. Antoine Fleuret, French Army; CAPT David Gray, U.S. Navy, and City Virginia Beach City Council Member, Cash Jackson-Green, representing the Mayor, the Honorable Bobby Dyer.

Special attendees included two brothers Nash and



Lindsay Bilisoly, direct descendants of Antonio Sylvestre Bilisoly, a sailing master of Admiral de Grasse's flagship, the Ville de Paris, who participated in the historic sea battle.

The Battle of the Virginia Capes sometimes called the Battle of the Chesapeake is a unique engagement because no Americans participated in a sea battle that changed the strategic environment that significantly enabled the independence of the United States of America. In 1781 the new United States had been at war for six years.

A force of 5,500 French soldiers with a supporting

naval squadron had been in America for over a year without a decisive military action.

All that changed in August 1781 when Admiral de Grasse ordered his French fleet with 26 ships of the line (ships with 64 or more guns) to the Chesapeake Bay from his anchorage on the North coast of Haiti. Generals Washington and Rochambeau began moving their troops from the Hudson River Valley south to link up with de Grasse's fleet as soon as they learned of his movement.

As the allied land forces moved south, the French fleet entered the Chesapeake Bay, anchored near the mouth of the Lynnhaven River, and began offloading 3,200 soldiers who accompanied the fleet north. At this point, the allies controlled the timing and tempo of operations. The British fleet, under Admiral Thomas Graves, countered the allied moves, and the Battle of the Capes ensued.

Historians consider this one of the more important naval battles in the history of warfare because it prevented the reinforcement or escape of over 8,000 British forces in fortified positions at Yorktown, setting the conditions for their surrender.

Without the success of the French Navy on September 5, 1781, in preventing the British from reinforcing Lord Cornwallis at Yorktown, there would have been no surrender of British forces on October 19, 1781.

Representing the Virginia Society of the OFPA was former Governor Kenneth Hawkins, Secretary Tim Ahlgrim, and Associates Bob Bruce and Stuart Whitehead.

VASSAR Semi-Annual Weekend

On the 19th of September, the Virginia SAR began its Semi-Annual Weekend. The meetings were preceded by a five-patriot grave marking ceremony at Ketoctin Baptist Church in Purcellville, Virginia.

A very special site where over thirty patriot ancestors are at rest. The OPFA was well represented by Governor Barnard, Jeff Thomas, former Governors Ken Hawkins and Michael Weyler, and Associates Michael Wilson, Stuart Whitehead, and John Lynch.

The real impact of our Order came to life at the hotel. Michael Wilson took the lead in exhibiting a special OFPA table on both Friday and Saturday of

the Convention. He displayed our flag, a selection of OFPA books, brochures and trinkets, and even his own OFPA Certificate.



The table attracted considerable attention to our Order from the members of the Virginia SAR. Between Governor Barnard and Associate Wilson, they spoke to over twenty-five members who showed serious interest in joining our prestigious society.



Patriot Gravesite Rededication

On September 28th the Richmond VASSAR joined with the Frances Bland Randolph DAR to rededicate and mark the graves of two Revolutionary War patriots whose graves are hidden away along the Appomattox River on the campus of Virginia State University.

It was a celebration of the patriotism of John and Frances Bland Randolph, who used their vast plantations to provide financial resources and

supplies to support the Virginia Militia in 1775 and the Continental Army throughout the American Revolution.



The event was held at the Randolph Farm Agricultural Complex on the grounds of Virginia State University and was attended by 15 different SAR Chapters from across the State, 7 different DAR Chapters, along with representatives from the CAR and other dignitaries.

Governor Barnard spent 12 months overseeing the restoration of the patriot graves and the surrounding fence for this small graveyard. Once completed, this provided the spark for organizing this extensive event, which saw University officials and professional singers come together with the SAR and DAR to deliver an impressive program for all in attendance.

Governor Barnard unveiled a beautiful bronze plaque which will be permanently affixed to a custom designed granite plinth and set before the graves ensuring that generations to come will know the story of these two patriots.



For his work, Governor Barnard was awarded the DAR Bronze Medal of Distinction for extraordinary cooperation and outstanding service to the NSDAR.
