Wreaths may be presented by all Societies/Foundation. Please notify Gov Lyman by 10 October to be included on published program to give remarks or to present wreaths.

Cranston Williams a descendant of the Augustine Warners will talk about them and his connection a the cemetery. In Event of inclement weather he will give his talk at the luncheon. There will also be a speaker about the Gloucester County militia at the cemetery.

17 OCT-4:00pm: Return to Duke of York Hotel

17 OCT-6:30pm: Travel to White Hall Inn restaurant in Williamsburg. Directions will be provided at the luncheon.

17 OCT-7:00pm: Dinner at White Hall Inn Restaurant in Williamsburg.
