Directions to the March 27, 2010 events.

Directions from Culpeper, Warrenton & Northern Virginia:

Proceed to Fredericksburg, take Route 3 East about 90 miles to Kilmarnock turn right on route 200, after four miles: to **Luncheon** turn left route 646 (Old Salem Rd) after one mile turn right on Lancaster Drive to Rappahannock Westminster Canterbury Retirement Center: to **Historic Christ Church** turn right route 629 (Christ Church Rd) go one mile to church on left.

Alternate route (a little faster) below Fredericksburg on I-95 take route US 17 South through Tappahannock to Saluda, turn left on route 33, after about 8 miles, turn left on route 3 and proceed across river to White Stone. **To Luncheon** after one more mile on route 3 turn left on route 646 (Old Salem Rd), after two miles turn left into Lancaster

Drive to Rappahannock Westminster Canterbury Retirement Center. **To Historic Christ Church** turn left on Route 200, go three miles through Irvington, turn left on Route 629 (Christ Church Rd), go one mile to church on left.

Directions from Richmond and points south and west of there:

Take I-64 East about 25 miles, then Route 33 East through West Point and Saluda then seven miles more turn left on Route 3 and proceed across river to White Stone. **To Luncheon** after one more mile on route 3 turn left on route 646 (Old Salem Rd), after two miles turn left onto Lancaster Drive to Rappahannock Westminster Canterbury Retirement Center. **To Historic Christ Church** turn left on Route 200, go three miles through Irvington, turn left on Route 629 (Christ Church Rd), go one mile to church on left


Directions from Hampton, Norfolk & Virginia Beach:

Take I-64 West to Route 17 North to Gloucester, turn left on Route 3 West, across river to White Stone. **To Luncheon** after one more mile on route 3 turn left on route 646 (Old Salem Rd), after two miles turn left onto Lancaster Drive to Rappahannock Westminster Canterbury Retirement Center. **To Historic Christ Church** turn left on Route 200, go three miles through Irvington, turn left on Route 629 (Christ Church Rd), go one mile to church on left.

Directions from Williamsburg:

Take Colonial Parkway to Yorktown, proceed north on Route 17 North to Gloucester, turn left on Route 3 West and proceed across river to White Stone. To Luncheon after one more mile on route 3 turn left on route 646 (Old Salem Rd), after two miles turn left onto Lancaster Drive to Rappahannock Westminster Canterbury Retirement Center. To Historic Christ Church turn left on Route 200, go three miles through Irvington, turn left on Route 629 (Christ Church Rd), go one mile to church on left.
