A bronze plaque recently was dedicated marking the gravesites of colonial patriots interred in Christ Church near Weems.

The plaque was presented jointly by the Virginia Society of the Order of the Founders and Patriots of America (VASOFPA), the Richard Henry Lee Chapter of the Sons of the American Revolution (RHLSAR), the Virginia Society of the Daughters of the Founders and Patriots of America (VADFPA), and the War of 1812 Society in Virginia.

The plaque bears the names of two founders (residents of Virginia prior to 1673), two Revolutionary War patriots, and six War of 1812 soldiers.

The presiding officer was governor Myron E. Lyman Sr. of VASOFPA. Other speakers and presenters included president Stanley L. Cichowicz of RHLSAR, president Carla W. Odom of VADFPA, Andrew M.

Johnson, Deputy President General, War of 1812 Society, and president Robert L. Bowen of the Virginia Society SAR.

Historic Christ Church Foundation executive director Camille E. Bennett accepted the plaque.

The presentation was preceded by a luncheon at Rappahannock Westminster- Canterbury Retirement Center.

With Washington All The Way!

2010 Memorial Service to honor John Shepherd.

John Shepherd served in two wars with George Washington, being at "Braddock's defeat" when the British commanding general was killed and Lt. Col. Washington (one of Braddock's aides-decamp) assumed active direction of the British and colonial remnants in the withdrawal from Pennsylvania (in the French and Indian War), as well as with Washington throughout the Revolutionary War. Sergeant Shepherd is the last survivor of Braddock's ill-fated expedition and the longest lived soldier of the American Revolution-- having fought at Brandywine, Germantown and White Marsh, as well as wintering at Valley Forge – when he died in Ohio in 1847 at the age of 117 years and nine months.

A grave-marking ceremony to commemorate the life and military service of John Shepherd is scheduled for June 26, & 27, 2010 in North Royalton, Ohio (near Cleveland). The ceremony has been endorsed and will be attended by many groups, to include The Society of the Cincinnati, General Society of Colonial Wars, Sons of the Revolution, and Carlyle House Historical Park (Braddock's Headquarters in Alexandria, Virginia). To name only a few.

John Shepherd is the fourth Great Grandfather of VA OFPA Attorney General Charles Phebus. Charles will lay a wreath on behalf of the Virginia Society OFPA.

Some of the events planned are a parade by the city of North Royalton, reenactor groups (French and Indian and American Revolution), bag pipers, fifes and drums, an ox roast plus a flintlock muzzle loaders match.

The top prize in the flintlock match is a replica Kentucky long rifle. PLUS...When was the last time you attended a whole ox roast?
